

...There is an exceptional cultural importance of the **Orthodox temple dedicated to the Holy Physicians Kuzman and Damian** and rural – **Srem house known as the "Savić house"**.



The church was built in 1754 in Baroque style, and on the façade there can still be seen cannonballs which the village was targeted with during the revolutionary events in 1848. In the interior there is very richly carved iconostasis that was done by Marko Gavrilović, together with his son Arsenije Marković. The iconostasis was made in 1773, mostly painted by the greatest Serbian Baroque painter Teodor Kračun, while some compositions are the work of Stefan Gavrilović (1800). In the church, there are also preserved three icons from the old iconostasis from 1741, the work of zograph Stanoje Popović.

Priceless treasure of Neštin Orthodox church represents the icon from the Virgin's throne, painted by the priest Rafailo Miloradović from Bačka Palanka for the family Rašković in 1724. Particularly interesting is the record that this iconographer left on the back of the picture, which highlights the troubles that occurred to him during painting. Soon, the Holy Mother of God of Neštin began pouring tears and today it is one of the most miraculous crying icons.

The hospitality, great wine and a variety of homemade food, made with ingredients grown in local gardens, along with the already mentioned, complement the picture of Neštin and invite you to visit it.

## NEŠTIN IN SREM

Wealth of tradition, nature and cultural heritage

Neštin, a village in the Western Srem, on the slopes of Fruška Gora and the bank of the Danube, is rich in natural beauty and cultural heritage. The important geographical location, as a meeting point of different civilizations and cultures has left its mark in many historical events, legends and traditions.

This area of the Pannonian Plain was inhabited in the early Stone Age, and the marks were left by Celts, Romans, Avars, Hungarians, and Slavs. The most important are the remains of Roman civilization, especially the imperial city of Sirmium in the vicinity, and the beginnings of the planting of vines and wine production are linked precisely for that period. Numerous archaeological sites with exceptional finds were discovered in the vicinity of the town, and among them "Kuluštra" stands out.

Neštin is also rich in natural resources, springs and viewpoints such as Gornja ada, Plaža pesak, Zeleno ostrvo, Podrumi, Donji kamen, Vinska terasa.

It is surrounded by beautiful and picturesque landscapes, both along the Danube, and in the area around the village, with the territory that borders the National Park Fruška Gora. Nearby there are medieval monasteries Đipša, Šišatovac and Kuveždin.

There are several bicycle and pedestrian lanes that go through the very village and around it. The beginning of the wine route starts right from Neštin which has the potential to become a centre of rural tourism.
